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Sedans with manual transmission 2019

Americans obviously hate manuals, so we never got these cars for shifts. In the United States, the chances of jumping into a handheld car gearbox are extremely low. Only about 6.5% of new cars are sold here with a stick, and this number is rapidly decreasing. European countries like the UK have a little more drivered manual engines, but they are also starting to prioritise automatics. Since the take-rate for manuals is low in the states, most automakers choose to offer only automatic transmissions. That said, there are a lot of great manual models that we can't get, and we've picked our five favorites. Alfa Romeo Giulia is the latest example to come to mind. Instead, the US received an eight-speed automatic transmission. And nothing else. There are many reasons why this could happen, but speculators believe it has something to do with crash testing. Now Americans have to drive their automatic Giulia, knowing that some Europeans are a little happier than they are, and rowing their own transfers. Another car on our list is another compact luxury sedan, the Jaguar XE. Like the Giulia, the XE was built to compete with the mighty BMW 3 Series. Like the Alfa Romeo, it was many years since Jaguar competed against BMW in this category, so it probably couldn't afford to offer two transmission options in the U.S. market. As with Giulia, the US-spec XE is only available with an eight-speed automatic in all trim. The six-speed XE manual will remain a prohibited fruit. Mercedes C-Class is completing a trio of BMW 3 Series competitors that do not offer manual transmission in the states. Unlike the Giulia Quadrifoglio and XE S, the C-Class manual is not available on high-performance models with an AMG badge. These cars still use the same seven- or nine-speed automatic we have in America, so this loss isn't as painful as the first two. Mercedes-Benz When we were looking for cars with manual transmission that are only sold in Europe, we didn't expect to find the Volvo S90 sedan and the V90. It's hard to believe that many people would order such a comfortable, luxury car with a manual, which may be why the S90 or V90 pictures with the manual are so hard to find. Volvo sells diesel engines that are not offered in the states, which might be more suitable for a manual transmission buyer. Volvo The last car on the list is no longer on sale, but we wanted to draw attention to it because of how cool it is. We thought the Porsche Panamera was only sold with a PDK gearbox, but it turned out that some markets had access to the six-speed manual. Although the most powerful turbo model was not available with the manual, buyers could get the RWD model with a 4.8-liter naturally suining V8. Unfortunately, the current Panamera is only offered with PDK. Porsche If you want to save then you have to buy one. The first series automatic transmission appeared in 1940, courtesy of Oldsmobile's Hydra-Matic. At four-speed speed on the floor, they waited at the door, but the manual survived for another 80 years. Now the dual-clutch automatic is so smooth and fast and programming so accurate that rowing has no advantages. For a while, better fuel consumption was the saving of manuals in everyday vehicles. These days, however, are gone, and the only remaining argument for the survival of the manual transmission is summed up with the cliché of the connection between man and machine. If you're one of the people who love manual transmission and are really willing to put your money where your mouth is by buying a luxury car, here's what you can buy in 2020. CarBuzz If you want something exotic from the factory, then Lamborghini, Ferrari and McLaren are now out of manual transmission games. To make sure the manual holds over time, though, Aston Martin has de-tuned the Mercedes-AMG delivering a 4.0-liter V8 at 461 lb-ft of the 505 lb-ft found in the automatic Vantage. Torque is further reduced in the first and second gears to limit the wheels from the line. Aston Martin Aston Martin BMW is trying to maintain its reputation as a brand enthusiast and the 2 Series is the highlight. It has the proportions of the BMW 3 Series E46 series, but a completely modern level of grip, performance and driving dynamics. You can pick up a BMW 230i coupe or M240i coupe and convertible with manual. Still, if you want to take advantage of more power and a tightly tuned chassis, the lightning-fast BMW M2 is also available with a turbocharging 405 hp in-line six-cylinder engine via a six-speed manual transmission. BMW If the 2 Series coupe is too small for you, then for some manual gearboxes, the rear wheel of the 4 Series or the ballistic-fast M4 is still on the table. The 430i, powered by a 2.0-liter turbocharged four-pot developing 248 hp and 258 lb-ft of torque, has a manual option. So is the more powerful 440i with two other cylinders that deliver 326 horsepower and 332 lb-ft. As a serious performance coupe with comfortable everyday riding chops, the M4 sets the bar and also has a manual option to go with its 425 hp and 406 lb-ft of torque in the base model. BMW BMW On paper, the Genesis G70 is a serious competitor to the BMW 3 Series, and we loved it with the 3.3-liter twin-turbo V6 under the hood. Unfortunately, there is no manual option for a more powerful engine. If you want to have three pedals, then you'll have to make do with 2.0-liter inline-four G70 shares with the Kia Stinger. It makes a healthy 255 hp and 260 lb-ft of torque. It is said that sometime in 2021 or 2022 the 2.0-liter engine is expected to be a 2.5-liter turbocharged four-cylinder engine that produces 290 hp and 310 lb-ft of torque. The bad news for manual enthusiasts is that the only available transmission is likely to be the new eight-speed dual-clutch gearbox. The CarBuzz CarBuzz Genesis Evora GT replaces the Evora 400 and Evora Sport 410 in the US in 2020. Along with the 416-horsepower turbocharging 6-cylinder Lotus six-cylinder engine with 317 lb-ft of torque, you have a choice between a six-speed manual transmission and an automatic transmission that powers a Torsen differential. The Golf R offers 288 horsepower and 280 lb-ft of torque over its four-cylinder 2.0-liter engine. Even with the manual option ticked, the Golf R will still drop sub-five-second 0-60 mph time.
